Attendance

Future Generation Trust places a high priority on achieving high standards and expects excellent standards of pupil attendance and punctuality. Regular attendance at school is crucial in raising standards in education and ensuring that every child can have full access to the school curriculum and reach their potential. Parents and carers have a legal duty to ensure that their child of compulsory school age attends school regularly and punctually on a daily basis.

Parents should plan their holidays around school breaks and avoid seeking permission to take their children out of school on holiday. The academy is unable to authorise holiday in term time and absence due to holiday may result in referral to the Local Authority for further action, including fining.

Please note that sun cream cannot be applied by academy staff so the children will need to know how to apply this themselves; it is recommended therefore that parents apply an all day, high-factor protection sun cream before school in order to avoid the need to apply sun cream during school time.

Free School Meals entitlement

Amid the ongoing hardships from the rising cost of living, some families may find that their circumstances have changed recently. Parents claiming some benefits can claim free school meals for any of their children who are registered at a Staffordshire school and who would normally be at school at lunch time.

School meals are a good way to ensure that your child eats well at lunchtime and you can save yourself time and money. You can only apply online if you meet the low income criteria. Remember, you can only claim free school meals if your child is going to be in Reception year or above when the meals begin. https://www.staffordshire.gov.uk/Education/Educational-awards-benefits/FreeSchoolMeals/Applyonline.aspx

After completing an application, you can print a copy of the confirmation page to give to the school for meals to start immediately. If you are unable to print you can still make your application online, but will need to wait for us to advise the school before you can start to receive the free school meals.

Well done to our Year 6 pupils

This half term has seen our Year 6 pupils undertake their SATS tests and they should all be so proud of the way they approached them. The pupils have shown great commitment in the way that they have prepared themselves for this year's tests, including giving up two (or three) evenings a week to attend extra revision sessions, having undertaken their own studies at home with resources kindly funded by the Friends of St. Peter's and having applied themselves with distinction in their lessons in the run up to this year's tests. As a cohort, they should be very proud of the way they have approached their KS2 assessments and the children, and the staff, should be commended for all they have done to prepare in recent weeks.

The end of SATS bowling and pizza making was a lovely way to mark the end of this testing period; lots of fun was had by all. Year 6's attention will now switch to Reaching for the Sky with their writing assessment for the coming weeks and to making lots of plans to end their time at St. Peter's on a high.

Year 4 Multiplication Check (June 2023)

For parents of pupils in Year 4, the Department for Education has produced a parent guide to the upcoming Multiplication Tables Check (MTC) that pupils will sit in June 2023. The purpose of the check is to determine whether your child can fluently recall their times tables up to 12, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It is an on-screen check consisting of 25 times table questions. Your child will be able to answer 3 practice questions before taking the actual check. They will then have 6 seconds to answer each question. On average, the check should take no longer than 5 minutes to complete. Year 1 Phonics Screening (June 2023)

For parents of pupils in Year 1, preparations are well underway for this year's Year 1 Phonics Screening check which will take place in school during the week commencing 12th June. The children will be screened on their ability to decode 40 words using their knowledge of phonic sounds; these 40 words will include some real words and some pseudo words (made up words). The check only takes a short amount of time to complete and will be administered by a member of staff familiar to your child.
